Art and Nature Entwined Program



LCF is committed to providing opportunities for individuals and communities to experience the synergy between art and nature. Toward that end, LCF sought out and received a grant from the Dale and Deborah Smith Foundation. This grant will provide the support to expand and enhance the inclusion of art focused nature experiences at our preserves into 2027. There is a reciprocal relationship underlying the two that leaves them inextricably connected. We are looking forward to bringing you programming as a part of this grant, some of which is included in the events section of this newsletter.

Luella's Lodge

Luella's Lodge is a nonprofit retreat center in Vermilion County, Illinois, dedicated to supporting families grieving the loss of a child through nature-based healing, retreat programming, and community connection. They requested ecological advice for their natural areas. LCF Executive Director, Eric Mollahan, joined them to discuss next steps for their three areas – pond health, woodland restoration and prairie establishment. Some preliminary recommendations were provided. Restoration is never a quick process; Many of our landscapes have been negatively impacted for decades, even centuries, and we won't be able to fix it overnight – but together, with some time, we can achieve anything. It was a pleasure to assist!



Did you know?



LCF has been assisting IDNR with the identification and documentation of snakes near one of our properties. Contracted by IDNR to document details about location, species and individual features, the primary focus of this job is to identify the endangered Kirtland's Water Snake throughout the area. Currently, we have identified more than 40 individual Kirtland's Water Snakes!

Caterpillar study

Jasmine Hollow, LCF's newest property, is the site of a Caterpillar Study being conducted by the Illinois Natural History Survey. In 2025, 13 species of caterpillar were observed onsite during 3 field visits. This year, the study continues and we are so excited to see what is observed this season. We will keep you updated on some of the data and let you know if we find anything special!



Water Quality Testing

LCF is helping test water quality in a series of basins in Champaign. We will be testing for phosphorous in 5 locations to determine if water quality is improving as it moves through conveyance (stormwater) systems. It's an important time to think about how individual activities can impact surrounding water quality. Runoff ultimately leads to the tributaries, rivers and lakes which define our region, recharge our aquifers and improve recreation.

Student's Consulting for Non-Profit Organizations

SCNO, a registered student organization at U of I, wrapped up their project with LCF in early May. We really appreciate their time and efforts and look forward to implementing some of their findings. It was a great experience to collaborate with the future stewards of our land.

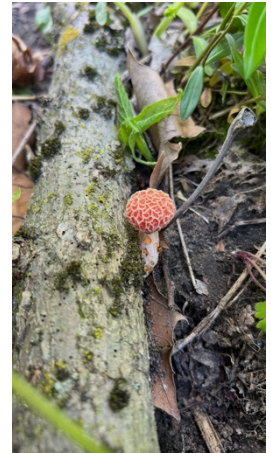
Public Event Updates

Brady Bluebell Hike



LCF's Brady Bluebell Hike, guided by Lynn Hawkinson-Smith, in late April was a blast! We saw so many neat trees and some rare plants, but the biggest find was observed by a hike participant. This person saw an odd fungus, identified as the wrinkled peach mushroom. This mushroom is known to exist in the region but is listed as near-threatened globally. Make

Stewardship Saturdays

We were fortunate enough to have decent weather for our stewardship Saturday events in April, May and June. Events took place at the Bruce Hannon Levee Trail and Mouth of Jordan. On our June stewardship day, we had a fawn join us temporarily for a minute quick chat and then take off into the adjacent wooded area. It was a truly unique experience – it seemed like the fawn was thanking us for the work we were



doing! Garlic mustard and honeysuckle were the primary focus of our stewardship, and we got a lot done. Garlic mustard and honeysuckle are both allelopathic species, meaning they release chemical compounds into the surrounding soil to give them a competitive advantage over our native species, ultimately displacing them and reducing biodiversity. Thank you to the volunteers who joined us! The next Stewardship Saturdays are July 11th, August 8th, and September 12th. Flora Fanatics

The May and June Flora Fanatics plant ID hikes were a pleasure to lead. We saw plenty of unique species and discussed how to manage some problematic species commonly found in the region. Though water levels were high at the Bruce Hannon



Levee Trail, there were plenty of areas to explore. The high water levels also presented an opportunity to discuss the importance of protecting wetlands and floodplains, which mitigate flooding, filter water and provide rare habitat for wildlife.

Dragonflies are incredibly important to our local ecosystem. Did you know that Dragonflies begin their life in water before emerging and shedding an exoskeleton. Ultimately, wings emerge and they take flight. Dragonflies hunt mosquitos in both their aquatic stage and their terrestrial stage with an extremely high success rate – even more reason to make sure we provide them an opportunity to thrive! At Mouth of Jordan, we have habitat that is conducive to harboring an array of native dragonflies. Land Conservation Foundation 2026-2027 Photo Competition!

- 2.) Photos must be taken on LCF properties (see LCF website for publicly accessible sites) beginning in 2026.

- 4.) You may enter two photos per category.
- 5.) Final submittals are due by May 30th, 2027.
- 6.) You may not digitally enhance (edit) the photographs except for cropping, except for in the “Creative” category.

Event: Sangamon River Bluff Trail Ribbon Cutting

What: Join us to celebrate the connection of LCF, IDNR and Allerton trails.

Come out and join us for the ribbon cutting for the Sangamon River Bluff Trail. This event highlights a collaboration between LCF, the City of Monticello, Illinois Department of Natural Resources, the Illinois Nature Preserves Commission and Allerton Park and Retreat Center. The ribbon cutting will be in the parking lot, located at 802 Allerton Road in Monticello. Attendees are encouraged to hike what they are comfortable with. LCF’s Bruce Hannon Levee Trail is about 2 miles and the entire length of the Sangamon River Bluff Trail, which ends at the Buck Schroth parking lot at Allerton Park, and is approximately 4.5 miles. Please bring your own water and snacks if desired. This hike offers scenic views of the Sangamon River not common in the region. It is a moderately challenging hike with a rustic feel – some obstacles remain if they do not prevent hiking on the trail. If you are interested in attending, please reach out to Eric Mollahan.
